## Business Meeting Minutes March 13, 2012

Board members in attendance were Brenda Beckmann, Jackie Harder, Edwin Linares, Tess Marra and Scott Robinson. A quorum was present. Also in attendance were Jack Bridges, KLVAC attorney and Chief Donald Bock. Membership attendance is reflected in the monthly attendance roster.

#### 1. Call to Order

Meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Vice-President, Scott Robinson.

- Brenda Beckman reported that the FKCC EMT students will be doing their ride time during March and April.

#### 3. Approval of Minutes

Jackie Harder motioned to approve the February 14, 2012 minutes. Brenda Beckmann seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

### 4. Treasurer's Report

Tess Marra reported that neither she nor Chief Bock were able to obtain a balance amount as they were unable to access the accounts through the internet. Receipts from the donation letter are approximately \$13,800.

#### 5. Committee Reports

There were no committee reports.

#### 6. Legal Report

Jack Bridges reported that rather than presenting a formal resolution to the BOCC for the proposed lighting at Publix, he had prepared letters to be sent to several resources. Jackie Harder motioned to, with corrections to the letter as noted and with Ronnie's signature on KLVAC letterhead, send the letter prepared by Jack to DOT, Kenco Realty Corp, Publix, FKEC, Commissioner Murphy, and the Key Largo Chamber of Commerce. Edwin seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Chief Bock reported that budget issues will be discussed, at the earliest, at the May 7 District Board meeting. He requested any suggestions be given to him within the next three weeks.

Scott Robinson reported he had begun looking into the LOSAP program. He contacted an actuary for the county asking for a startup cost package that could be presented to the District Board. This item will be on the agenda for the April District Board meeting.

Brian O'Connor asked if any thought had been put into staffing the back-up ambulance with EMT's on weekends. Statistics will be gathered for the number of back up calls on weekends and who responded as an EMT. At that time costs may be factored into the budget.

Tess reported there will be an ambulance in the St. Patrick's Day parade on Saturday should anyone want to participate.

The District has put the old (Med 73) ambulance out to bid on a government website.

Pedro Marin asked George Mirabella to ask the board if during the time he is in school he can receive his full reimbursement even though he cannot attend the required meetings. The board stated this was an operational issue and the policy in place needs to be followed. Request denied.

Pamela Johnson Recording Secretary I don't have much to report other than the budget for FY 2013. You should have received a separate email with several documents attached. Some budget issues need to be discussed at the April 10<sup>th</sup> meeting.

In speaking with Commissioner Murphy, she asked that I relay information on the KL EMS Board's resolution regarding the street light at the Trade Winds Plaza area. She said "The information has been forwarded to the Department of Transportation and it is scheduled to be discussed at the meeting this month. The meeting will be held in Key Largo and will be covering the future modifications to the Overseas Highway in the Key Largo area."

Out of the twenty applicants for the paid paramedic position, only nine replied stating they still have an interest in the position with Key Largo EMS. We are in the process of scheduling testing date(s) to move forward with the process.

One of the salesmen for Stryker came by last Tuesday during the training meeting to demonstrate their new stretcher loading system. If the District Board agrees to fund the \$10,200 (10%) of the grant, we can move forward and apply for a State grant (90%) to purchase them for the four ambulances. It's a lot of money for the stretcher loading systems (\$102,000 for all four), but it will eliminate the need to lift the stretcher into the ambulance and help reduces potential back injuries. Those that tried it said it was very easy to load the stretcher. The question many had was "when are they going to invent something to get the patient from the upstairs bedroom to the ambulance without lifting..."

We still have one truck at the Ford dealer in Homestead. I think over the last year or two we have had three trucks running more often than not. The turbo is bad and had to be rebuilt – covered under warrantee. CeCe has been staying on top of the repair work at Ford. It is the fourth time it went to Ford for the same related problem, and Ford has been very good about their warrantee coverage.

D Fernandez	7.5 hours OT	Two 24 hour shifts equals 8 hours OT per week. In late (9:30am) one day and left early (6am) one day the first week; left early (6am) two days the second week. Thus 4.5 hours OT the first week and 3 hours OT the second week. Also adjust for daylight saving's time (lost one hour pay).
F Jones	25 hours OT	Two 24 hour shifts equals 8 hours OT per week. Held over (5 pm) one day the first week (Dr. apt). Thus 17 hours OT the first week and 8 hours OT the second week.
E Mesa	36.25 hours OT	Two 24 hour shifts equals 8 hour OT per week. In early (6:30am) one day, covered a 24 hour shift for sick medic (8am to 8am), one late call while holding over (9:45am) and assisted on one call (one hour OT) one day the second week. Thus 36.25 hours OT the second week.
