AGENDA

1.A. Call to Order

Chairman Allen called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

1.B. Pledge of Allegiance

Commissioner Beyer led the Pledge of Allegiance.

1.C. Roll Call

Vicky Fay called the roll. The following Commissioners were present: Tony Allen, Marilyn Beyer, Kay Cullen, George Mirabella and Bob Thomas. There was a quorum.

Also present were: Don Bock, Vicky Fay, Jennifer Johnson, Scott Robinson and Theron Simmons. The meeting was held at Station #24.

1.D. Approval of Agenda

 $\underline{\textit{MOTION:}}$ Commissioner Cullen made a motion to approve the September 14, 2015 1^{st} Public Hearing Agenda. Commissioner Beyer seconded the motion, and the Board unanimously passed the motion.

2. PUBLIC COMMENT

No members from the General Public addressed the Board.

3. DISCUSSION: KLFR&EMS District FY 2015-2016 Proposed Budget

The newly-proposed millage rate for FY 2015-2016 is .8223 mills, which is a 9.89% increase over the roll-back rate. The Ad Valorem taxes are projected at \$2,615,029. The millage rate increase is projected at \$7.00 per \$100,000 of taxable value. The Fire Department reduced the capital requests and the Corps removed the "mule".

District Budget

A new account will be added to the Budget for the Cadet Program. The District budgeted \$1,200 in the District Budget, and reduced Account 400, the Travel Budget by \$1,200.00 to create a wash. The increase in the Clerk budget-line item is not a pay increase, it is for additional grant preparation.

There are two engines scheduled for replacement in 2018 for approximately \$1,050,000 Commissioner Cullen is concerned about vehicle repair.

Jennifer Johnson noted the District has lost a billion dollars in taxable revenues since the District began, Commissioner Allen would like to achieve rollback.

3. <u>DISCUSSION: KLFR&EMS District FY 2015-2016 Proposed Budget</u> (Continued)

Fire Department and Ambulance Corps

Acct 120 Regular Salaries & Wages and

<u>Acct 121 Volunteer Pay</u> Commissioner Beyer felt a three (3%) increase was too much. In December 2014 the social security cost of living was 1.75; however, the national average for 2016 is projected at -0-%. Employers are not supporting cost-of-living raises, rather they are supporting increases based upon performance. A three (3%) increase is a \$12,230 expense. The Fire Department received a 3% increase last year. Commissioner Thomas indicated he could support a 1.5% increase. Commissioner Mirabella indicated that Monroe County proposed a .8% increase. This item should be reduced to 1.5%.

Fire Department

Acct 140 Overtime Wages: Overtime has increased significantly. The Chief indicated it was due to Holidays.

<u>Acct 220: Retirement Plan</u> Currently the plan is 20% match up to a \$500 cap. Scott indicated he did discuss the plan with several members, and they indicated they might be interested. It is a contribution plan for individuals and the District. After discussion, the proposed plan for budgeting would be to match up to 20% of the individual's contribution, and the District's contribution <u>would not exceed</u> \$750.00 per individual, per year. The vesting period would be five (5) years. Commissioner Allen feels retirement is better than a raise. Commissioners Beyer, Allen and Mirabella felt the District would never be able to compete with a large department salaries and benefits.

<u>Acct 460 Repair & Maintenance: Equipment</u> The Radio Maintenance Contract is \$5,300, and it is for 46 radios and pagers and covers both the Fire Department and the Ambulance Corps. New radios are approximately \$4,000 each.

<u>Acct 460 Repair & Maintenance Buildings & Ground Equipment</u> Maintenance Plans were added for: The Generator (\$4,400), and the Station 24 and 25 Plymovent System (\$2,625). Chief Bock will review other possibilities for the Elevator Maintenance Plan.

<u>Acct 520.06 Bunker Gear:</u> 72 sets have been purchased since 2007. The District Board needs additional information about how many sets require replacement. Commissioner Allen would like to have a schedule for replacement.

Acct 521 Gasoline: It was noted the gasoline account has reduced significantly.

<u>Acct 640 Capital Outlay Equipment:</u> One Thermal Imaging Camera will be replaced due to a broken screen for \$6,000 – It would cost \$3,500 to refurbish it. The Rescue Jack was removed from the budget by the department.

<u>Acct 642 Capital Outlay: Small Tools & Equipment:</u> These are items that require repair or replacement due to their bad condition. Two portable radio head-sets for the pump panel operator will be added back into the budget because Commissioner Mirabella stressed this is a safety issue when fighting fires because the operators may not be able to hear the transmissions from the firefighters (\$920.00). Capital Outlay items are assets of the District and are inventoried.

3. DISCUSSION: KLFR&EMS District FY 2015-2016 Proposed Budget (Continued)

Ambulance Corps

<u>Accts 491.14 and 491.15:</u> The Crystal Reports are for patient and cardiac monitoring, and the 12-Lead ECG Class will be conducted in house (this training is every other year).

Acct 540 Dues and Subscriptions: This item should be raised to \$400.00.

<u>Acct 643 Capital Outlay Buildings</u>: The Classroom Air Conditioner of \$5,500 should be removed since it is still in working order. The Corps will revisit the air conditioner with the District Board when replacement is necessary.

Vehicle Replacement Schedule: Finance recommended the engines be staggered. Chief Bock will look into replacing Engine #24 in 2018 and moving Engine 25 replacement to 2019.

With these changes, the FY 2015-2016 proposed Ad Valorem tax rate is .8223 mills, which is greater than the roll-back rate of 0.7483 mills by 9.89%. Finance indicated the District is short of the three month operating fund balance by \$14,239.

4. ADJOURN

Commissioner Thomas made a motion to adjourn the 1st Public Hearing at 7:22 p.m., which was seconded by Commissioner Mirabella, and unanimously agreed upon by the board.
